# Easter Is Only The Beginning



here is the birth of Jesus, then the death and then the resurrection...isn't that it? As I grew spiritually and learned more about

the Bible, it became clear that Jesus' resurrection is only the end of a chapter. Yet, it's not the end of any of the gospels. The end of the Gospels end similarly, Matthew 16:16-20 (VOICE)

17 When the disciples saw Jesus there, many of them fell down and worshiped, as Mary and the other Mary had done. But a few hung back. They were not sure (and who can blame them?).

18 Jesus came forward and addressed *His beloved disciples*. The disciples don't know what to think or how to act. Nothing like this has ever happened before.

Jesus: I am here speaking with all the authority of God, who has commanded Me to give you this commission:

19 Go out and make disciples in all the nations. Ceremonially wash them through baptism in the name of the *triune God*: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

20 Then disciple them. Form them in the

practices and postures that I have taught you, and show them how to follow the commands I have laid down for you. And I will be with you, day after day, to the end of the age.

The story continues as we are called to spiritually grow. In the passage above, our spiritual truth, Jesus, also known as the I AM, calls us forth to move from being his disciples, his students to becoming his apostles; those who are sent forth to carry Jesus' teachings to the world.

Evangelists use this as the marching orders to proselytize. In the "Revealing Word," Charles Fillmore states, "[Proselyting] is not in accord with divine law. The Spirit of truth within is man's one and only guide." The scripture above then becomes our call to action. We are to continue to purify our lower states of consciousness with the spiritual Truths that our higher consciousness knows. The teachings of Jesus continue to evolve within us. We are told to evolve to our Christ natures as Jesus did and taught us how to

# **Grace Happens**

While visiting family in the 1990s I happened to spot a bumper sticker on a parked car while walking down a New Jersey treet. "Grace Happens", it proclaimed in a child's fanciful script. I got up close and found a Martha's Vine-

yard address in small print, copying it down on a scrap of paper. I had to have one! In fact, I ordered half a dozen so I could give them away when anyone asked me about it, which they occasionally did. A couple of times a conversation ensued: "What is grace, anyway?"

Think of the word "graceful". Now think of a majestic white swan, sleekly gliding on a still pond toward the far shore, barely disturbing the surface of the water as it moves. We call that graceful, because it slips so elegantly and effortlessly through the water and with such poise and selfassurance. You could say it has perfect faith in the flow of grace. It is one with the flow of the water and movement of the breeze, measuring each movement accordingly.

The flow of Divine Grace is always available to us. It does not descend from heaven every couple of years on a whim to toss us a coin or two. It is the free gift of the Creator ready to lavish its gifts upon us, no strings attached. All that it requires is a little willingness on our part to trust in the flow and a little lessening of the willfulness that we too often engage in instead.

It took three to four Open Mic performances to finally feel settled,

and then I just started having fun. I see now how those open mic performances built my confidence enough to eventually participate with the Unity band on Sundays. Rev Jim said something once that really made an impression. He said we are all manifestations of the Divine and that Unity is all about being a place where our Divinity can be expressed in our uniquely creative and spiritual ways.
