
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# **Looking for the Good**

IN THIS TIME OF ECONOMIC STRESS, many families will be turning toward their neighborhood food pantries for assistance.


You can support your neighbors by placing nonperishable goods in the collection basket in our Bradford Street Lobby.

## Spotlight on Service

Almost from the time of his arrival at Unity, Bill has given service in activities that have given him a deep sense of belonging to the church community and the satisfaction of helping individuals and the church itself. As well, his involvements have been in activities he enjoys and are practical to his abilities and time restraints. No job has been to too small or as his acceptance and election to the Board of Trustees proves, too big for him. He is one of a steadily growing group of volunteers who are providing a loving energy that positively affects our entire church community. Without the steady core of dedicated individuals such as Bill and many others our church would not be able to survive and prosper as it has.

"I DISCOVERED UNITY in the summer of 2003 seemingly by accident, although I now wonder if there really is such a thing as an "accident." I stumbled across some information on the internet about Unity and I was amazed that the Unity philosophy was so similar to my own. I was intrigued at the emphasis on meditative prayer so I decided to check it out.

On that first Sunday, I met a tall friendly minister and many others (who seemed addicted to hugging). Everyone I met acted as if they'd known me all their lives. It did indeed feel like coming home and I decided learn more. One of the things that I was to learn was the Unity philosophy about service.

Regarding service — years ago I recall being amazed at the lifelong service given by Dr. Schweitzer and so many others to those who could offer nothing in return. Once I became connected to Unity I found that service to others, usually on a less grand scale, is central to our church. It was here that I came to realize that we can't individually do everything but we can all do something.

I've been very inspired by seeing Dennis Ryan and Rev. Phil's giving of themselves whenever and wherever help is needed. Their dedication still impresses me. There are many others in Unity who've made huge personal sacrifices for no apparent reason other than to help others. These people really "walk the walk" and I'm proud to belong to an organization with such caring people.

One thing I've learned is that even small amounts of giving, in the form of time and effort, pay big dividends in terms of self satisfaction. It seems that the law of prosperity also applies to time and talent as well as treasure. As Dennis likes to say, "...God is the source of my good."

For me personally, my first foray into volunteering was to help to prepare "The Messenger" for mailing. This is always a fun job with lots of banter and sometimes some interesting serious conversation. I have also had the opportunity to help with our after-service hospitality. This always provided instant gratification from our appreciative members.

Not all ministering at Unity involves visible efforts. I feel privileged to belong to our church's prayer group and, along with Dennis Ryan, I monitor our prayer request phone line and prayer website. I also work with Donna Britton and others to record each day's "Daily Word" on our Albany Unity phone service line. Probably the activity I enjoy most is being a Prayer Chaplain. This has enabled me to become friends with members who were only acquaintances up to the time we prayed together. Being a chaplain helps me remember the longstanding principle that Unity should be a "Practical Christianity" which teaches that we can resolve any challenge through prayer.

I generally look for things to get involved in which I feel will be interesting and that are practical for me to take on. I was recently approached to run for our board and I accepted — although I thought that maybe I wasn't the best candidate for the job because there are many other experienced and talented members in our church. Now, as a newly elected trustee, I have agreed to be our "Building Manager" which will be a new experience for me and I'm sure educational as well. I never realized how much is involved in the day-to-day operations of a church until I got a glimpse of it while volunteering.

I believe that the satisfaction of being able to contribute something to Unity far outweighs any inconvenience involved. I also think that any organization's vitality is directly proportionate to the involvement of its membership. A congregation that is united in service promotes growth of the church on all levels and I'm fortunate to be in the company of many who share their talents and time. Everyone is always willing to help new volunteers and gladly share their knowledge and experience. Let's keep our Church moving forward, after all, God doesn't need a church; it's here to minister to our needs.
