Looking For A Messiah

CHRISTMAS IS THE TIME we celebrate the birth of Jesus of Nazareth, the Christian messiah. It's also the time many Christians look forward to the day when Jesus will return and set the world right. People of the Jewish faith are still awaiting the birth of

t h e i r messiah. According to their tradition first Elijah will return heralding the coming, and then the messiah will return restoring Israel to its place of glory. I recently learned that some Buddhists are also expecting a messiah. Ancient Pail texts speak not only of the historical Buddha, but also of Maitreya, the Buddha to come. For some Buddhists Maitreya has become a messiah figure, one whose return is expected to bring peace and harmony to the world. It seems like everyone is looking for a messiah. *Why are these messiahs so hesitant to show up? Can't they see that we need their help?*

In earliest writings of the Old Testament there are no references to a messiah. The concept of a messiah developed later in Judaism. Even as it developed there was no clear consensus on just what the messiah would do. Fast forward several hundreds of years to the followers of Jesus, a group of Jews. They desperately wanted Jesus to be the Jewish messiah, the one who would straighten out their complex and troubling world. When they compiled their gospels some took great liberties reinterpreting Old Testament passages, often forcing messianic references onto verses that had nothing to do with a messiah. The Apostle Paul was so convinced that Jesus was the messiah and that his physical return was imminent; he urged his followers not to challenge the current social order because Jesus would be back soon to straighten things out for them. Unfortunately Paul was mistaken, as were the disciples who expected Jesus' physical return. Today with no apparent messiahs on the horizon we may look toward others to save us or heal our world. We may look toward political or social leaders. We may search for perfect bosses, parents or partners to save us from the troubles of our day-to-day lives.

Unity reminds us that right now, we are individualized expressions of God. Just like Jesus whose birth we celebrate at Christmas, we are eternal spiritual beings. As such we are creat-

ing and experiencing our lives here. Individually and collectively we are the messiahs that we and the world have been waiting for. We are

the ones with the power to anchor divine order and blessing in our world. And we are the ones with the power to transcend all apparent limitations including birth and death. We will not do this through force of will or magic powers, but by connecting with the Spirit within and allowing it to live through us. If our spiritual understanding is still immature this may seem like a distant dream. We may be like the infant Jesus, not yet able to walk or speak on his own. However, if we are willing to persist in our spiritual ma-

OUR UNITY CHURCH is governed by a Board of Directors, 6 members selected on a rotating basis for 3 year terms at the church's annual meeting held on the first Sunday in March. Members may serve 2 consecutive terms before they must rotate off of the Board.

Board candidates are selected by the Nominating Committee, formed each year at this time, consisting of Rev. Jim, a congregation member selected by a vote at the last annual meeting and a Board member selected by the Board. They select a fourth person who serves as Chair of the Committee. Another way Board candidates are selected is by nominations from the floor at the annual meeting.

Using a thoughtful and centering prayer process, each Board Member decides which of the 6 ministries he or she would like to be the liason for: Building and Grounds, Finance, In-reach/Out-reach, Special Events, Spiritual Education or Worship Service. Also using prayer and divine guidance, the Board members and Reverend Jim collectively select their officers: President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Each "Ministry Team" is made up of congregants who feel called to give of their time and talent in particular ways to serve, such as: ushering, offering flowers for the Sunday service, providing hospitality (aka food!) for after the service, teaching Youth Education, working in the Bookstore, helping with maintenance and repairs, working in the garden, serving on the Unity Cares Committee, helping to organize the annual Christmas Party or Spiritual Retreat, singing in the 4th Sunday Singers, counting the offering after services (aka "Tellers").

The list of each Board Member and their Ministry is in the church bulletin each week. If you feel some call to service, please contact the appropriate Board Member.

turing we will connect with more and more of the Presence and in doing so bring more and more of God's presence and power into our world.

The prophet Isaiah writes of a child who would soon be born and named Emmanuel (or Immanuel.) Emmanuel means God with us. Isaiah's Emmanuel prophecy was given as a warning of impending social events in the time of Isaiah, not as a prediction of a future messiah.

It was the disciple Matthew who imagined Isaiah's Emmanuel as a prophecy of a coming messiah who might save him and his people from their oppressors. Seizing upon this idea he incorporated the Emmanuel reference into his story of the birth of Jesus. From those two biblical references we sing the Christmas refrain: O' Come O' Come Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel. If we sing this as a prayer for some external messiah to show up and save us we may be disappointed.

Yes, Jesus and others are present in spirit to support us in our spiritual growth and development, but so far throughout all of recorded history no external messiah has ever showed up and saved any nation or religious group from itself. If however we sing O' Come O' Come Emmanuel as a prayer to the presence of God within us (the true meaning of Emmanuel) perhaps we will experience the miraculous revelation that God is with us, now. God is, as the poet Tennyson wrote, "closer than breathing and nearer than hands and feet." As we learn to sense the Emmanuel presence in this very personal way we begin to find the peace, protection and power that bless and save both our world and our selves. O' Come O'Come Emmanuel, into my mind and my life today.

May we all seek and find the true messiah this *Christmas. And, in our finding may we experience the* peace and joy that this very special season promises. Amen.

Spotlight on Service

Since coming to Unity, Pamela has challenged herself to leave her comfort zone and to express herself through her love and her God-given gifts. Her quiet ways have given way to reveal a beautiful soul who is a true student of Unity teaching, someone who goes out of her way to be of service, and helps others feel at home in our

church. Her subtle sense of humor and disarming smile make her a joy to be around.

"I FOUND A JOURNAL ENTRY that I wrote in March of 2001, in which I asked God to help me. At the time I was tired and feeling empty and hopeless. I remember not long after that feeling as if I was going to die. I was very scared. I spoke to a co-worker about how I was feeling and she told me that there was more then one way you could die and maybe I was dying in a different way. Her words calmed me, but I still felt death coming. Not long after that conversation I received an e-mail at work from a friend and it was a letter from God. It wasn't one of those usual chain e-mails that tell you to send it to 10 other people. I was the only recipient and as I read it I started to cry. I felt God's love and his presence, and I felt something in me beginning to change. Then I thought I needed to find a church home so when I died my kids could have my service in a church. At the same time I was afraid of church because of my religious upbringing. A few months after 9/11 a friend approached me and asked if I would join her in searching for a church. I said 'sure, why not.'

A few days later she came to me and said she had found Unity Church of Albany. So, we came here the next Sunday which was in early January of 2002. Dennis Ryan was conducting the Service and I don't recall what he was saying but whatever it was it touched me and tears rolled down my face. I knew I was home! I became a member while Paula was our interim pastor. I remember the day she anointed me and the other new members as a day I will never forget. By the time Jim Fuller became the Minister I was the chairperson for the Ushers but it had taken its toll on me, so I left Unity for a little over a year. During that time away I read the bible all the way through and I started feeling an urge to find out more about what Jesus was really trying to tell us. So I came back to Unity, but this time with a thirst for knowledge. The Quest and A Course in Miracles were the answer and little by little I built-up my beliefs, and gathered in and began emptying my "bags of luggage." My little child was able to let go of her "story" and my relationship with Mother-Father God, The Universe, and the Beloved, just took off.

Now, as I look back, I realize that I did die; the Pamela I use to be before March 2001, no longer existed. I now know I am not alone, my life has purpose, and I know, being a child of God, that all is well. I also realized that one of my purposes was to be here at Unity like Dennis Ryan was there that day for me. So when I was asked to run for the Board of Directors almost two years ago, my answer was yes. I find it a true joy and an honor to serve some of the best stuff in the world today.

The various ways I have served in Unity are: as chairperson of the Ushers and now I usher whenever I'm needed; I've served on the Garden Committee, the planning committee for the Unity Cares Committee, and last year helped to set up for the church Christmas party.

I am also now in the second year of my three year term on the board of Trustees. In my first year I was a Trustee in charge of Building and Grounds. This year I am serving as the Treasurer. Actually to be honest someone has always asked me to be involved and I have just always said yes. It has just felt right for me.

Being of service has helped me come out of my shell and I've gotten to know other people. I am actually a loner and somewhat shy, but not as shy as I use to be.

Service has also taught me there are more then two ways to look at things, and what really has surprised me is that I find that I have more in common with people than I thought. Service has showed me that I have a lot more to give then I thought I did and I love knowing that."
